Sudan goes to the polls



The Most Rev. Dr. Daniel Deng Bul Tak, Episcopal Archbishop of Sudan cast his vote on the first day of voting in the historic referendum. Archbishop Daniel spoke of his elation at having finally voted, "We have been waiting 55 years for this day. This is the day, this is our time." He called the referendum a bridge to a new Sudan and added that this day marked the start of an important chapter in the history of Sudan.

Five Talents is deeply involved in supporting the Episcopal Church of Sudan and works in partnership with the Mothers' Union and World Concern to implement the Literacy Financial Education Programme (LFEP) in 6 Dioceses. This will enable the poor to develop literacy and business skills, helping them to access savings and credit groups. The programme is unique because it is run by local leaders and is expected to reach 30,000 clients.
